

AAH successes

Top Exam Scores

- AAH students excelled in their national exams for five years running, leading nearly 100 government schools in Bududa district
- Typical village schools send less than 14% of students to secondary school. In striking contrast, AAH sent nearly 100% of its first five graduating classes

Secondary scholarships

- AAH's Wamundu Secondary Scholarship Fund supports the continued education of our graduates
- The fund also supports top students from local village schools
- Currently, 200 AAH graduates are on AAH scholarships
- Half of our scholarship recipients are girls

Teacher Training and Outreach

- AAH assists 18 local village schools with approximately 15,000 students through teacher training workshops and by providing their students with school supplies, play equipment and musical instruments.

Community Health Centers

- AAH's clinic provides free care for AAH students, teachers, and all villagers with lifesaving medical treatment
- The clinic is operated in partnership with the Foundation for Medical Relief of Children
- AAH operates a second clinic in Bupoto village
- The two clinics combined serve approximately 30,000 children and other villagers annually

U.S. Teachers and Volunteers

- Every year, public and private school teachers and other volunteers travel to Uganda at personal expense to provide the gift of their teaching expertise and special support to students, teachers and administrators
- Nearly 25 volunteers have worked at AAH over the past year

Economic and Community Development

- The AAH school farm is now earning income
- We introduced Women's Microfinance in 2010 and now have 80 local village women with small businesses, and more coming
- We have completed a community clean water well

Global Reading Challenge

- AAH holds an annual school-wide reading challenge with sister school Arlington Traditional School (ATS) of Arlington, VA
- During each challenge, AAH students read approximately 15,000 books (25 pages = one book)

Library Learning Center

- AAH has a large freestanding library on school grounds, the first of its kind in the region
- The library significantly expands our capacity to add books, enrich learning through computer technology and help students improve reading skills
